

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Korean Acupuncture and Practice is based on understanding the constitutional energy traits of the patient which are considered as a main element in Sa Am and the basic Four Constitutions. New practical and integrated forms of therapeutic modalities will be covered.

Students will be able to identify the root cause of illness based on Korean Constitutional medicine. Students will be able to formulate an individualized point prescription to bring the patient back into balance. Students will be able to apply Korean acupuncture treatment using appropriate tonifying and reducing techniques.
