

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The fourth course in the Herb Pharmacopeia series. Herb Pharmacopeia IV covers herbs in the Qi Tonics, Blood Tonics, Yang Tonics, Yin Tonics, Stop Diarrhea, Astringe Essence, and External Application categories.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to list the characteristics and properties of each individual herb assigned, recognizing them by sight and using correct Latin and Pin-Yin nomenclature.
