Dr. Patrick Downie, Western Medicine Department Faculty Member, will be retiring from teaching in the MTOM program at the end of the Summer Quarter, 2018. This is due to family reasons that require him to relocate back to Florida. He will however continue teaching and being a capstone advisor in the DAOM program. So any student interested in his Palpation elective please take note. Emperor's College would like to express heartfelt thanks for all the hard work and expert teaching that he has provided to our students over the years! We look forward to his continued excellence as an instructor for our Doctoral program.

Speaking of our amazing faculty, Dr. Jacqueline Alder will be joining our college in the Fall quarter as yet another incredible professor for our MTOM and DAOM programs. She graduated from medical school at UTMB, the University of Texas Medical Branch, in Galveston, Texas. She completed her Internal Medicine Residency at UCSF, San Francisco. Prior to medical school, she completed her Masters of Public Health with emphasis in environmental epidemiology. It was during this program that her dedication to disadvantaged populations and world health issues became focused. It was a natural decision to go on to the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine for additional training. After returning from London, she completed an Infectious Diseases Fellowship at Stanford.

While at Stanford, Dr. Adler completed additional training at the Stanford Faculty Developmental Center for Medical Teachers. Since this time, she has acted as visiting faculty in Phnom Penh, Cambodia at the University of Health Sciences. She wrote, directed and taught an 8-week course in antibiotic use and infectious diseases pertinent to the Cambodian population. Her audience included medical students and residents as well as local physicians and surgeons. In addition, she has been affiliated with the University of Washington School of Medicine, teaching 3rd and 4th year medical students. As a team leader in the clinical setting, she strives to find 5-minute teaching sound bites for all levels of the medical staff. Her vast enthusiasm for teaching continues to this day.

Dr. Adler's scope of medical practice has been broad. Her interest in acupuncture and Oriental medicine began in the mid-1970's when she began seeing a Chinese acupuncturist for her own personal health. Her formal training in acupuncture began in 1985 through UCLA. Since that time she has become a practitioner of Auricular Acupuncture. She has

trained under Dr. Terry Oleson, Dr. Richard Nietzow and Dr. Rafael Nogier. Dr. Adler brings to Emperor's an excitement and passion for bridging and uniting the diverse paradigms and world views of both eastern and western medicine.

We are now into week three of the quarter with Summer quarter registration just seven weeks away. I am pleased to announce that we have a newly-added elective* this coming Summer quarter with Dr. Wilcox, as well as one with Dr. Downie (his very popular EL812 Palpation class).
