

Report on the Use of Funds Distributed to Emperor's College from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund

Updated January 28, 2021

The U.S. Department of Education published a Notice of Public Posting Requirement of Grant Information for Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) Grantees on August 31, 2020, directing institutions to report quarterly on the receipt and use of funds received from the HEERF established by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act).

The following report contains the information listed in the Department of Education's notice.

Emperor's College signed and submitted the Funding Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CARES Act to the Department of Education. Emperor's College signed and submitted the Funding Certification and Agreement for the Institutional Portion of the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Formula Grants Authorized by Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to the Department of Education.

Emperor's College received \$41,027 from the Department of Education for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

204 students were eligible to participate in under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965.

As of September 1, 2020, Emperor's College has awarded Emergency Financial Aid Grants to 127 students totaling \$41,148.

To determine which students would receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants for spring 2020 expenses, Emperor's College asked eligible students to complete an application for COVID-19 emergency assistance. All eligible students who completed an application for assistance received the same amount.

Emperor's College sent multiple emails to students regarding the availability of the emergency grants and posted the application on its website. Emperor's College provided further guidance to individual applicants by email, ranging from follow-up requests for documentation to notifications about grant decisions.
